
# RON KOSTYSHYN, NEW MINISTER OF INFRASTRUCTURE AND TRANSPORTATION AND EMERGENCY MEASURES, APPOINTED AND SWORN IN

Minister Ron Kostyshyn was officially sworn in on December 23, 2014 as minister of infrastructure and transportation and minister responsible for emergency measures following his appointment by Premier Greg Selinger. Minister Kostyshyn will also remain minister of agriculture, food and rural development, a post he has held since Jan. 13, 2012. The minister was elected as the member of the legislative assembly for Swan River on Oct. 4, 2011. Prior to that, Min. Kostyshyn served as reeve of the RM of Mossey River and on council for two decades, and served on a number of boards.

Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation (MIT) is responsible for the development of transportation policy and legislation, and for the management of the province's vast infrastructure network. To meet these responsibilities, the department delivers a wide range of programs and services that play a critical role in sustaining the contributions of the transportation sector to Manitoba's economic growth. MIT's transportation responsibilities include corporate policy and provincial legislation development, motor carrier safety and regulation enforcement, carrier permits and the development and implementation of sustainable transportation initiatives. The department's water control, drainage and transportation infrastructure management duties cover the construction, maintenance, and operation of 19,000 kilometres of all weather roads, 2,200 kilometers of winter roads, over 21,000 bridges and culverts, 4,700 kilometres of drains, 75 dams, 61 reservoirs, 41 pumping stations, 24 northern airports, and many other components. MIT is also responsible for the delivery of several transportation and infrastructure-related

services or programs such as air ambulance flights, water bomber operations, property management, procurement, material distribution, fleet vehicles, Crown Lands sewardship, mail management, and government building security across the province.

The Manitoba Water Council has been charged with reviewing the range of water conservation and efficiency initiatives that are taking place in Manitoba and across Canada and would like to hear from your organization. The information gathered will enable the Council to put forward advice and recommendations to the Minister of Conservation and Water Stewardship to develop a strong and pro active water conservation strategic path.

The Council defines water conservation as the policies, strategies and activities to manage fresh water as a sustainable resource, to protect the water environment, and to meet current and future human demand. Water efficiency is the smart use of our water resources through water-saving technologies and simple steps we can all take around the house. Using water efficiently will help ensure reliable water supplies today and for future generations. Water efficiency differs from water conservation in that it focuses on reducing waste, not restricting use although we recognize that conservation and efficiency measures are often complementary and inter-connected.

The Water Council would appreciate if you could answer the following questions pertaining to water conservation and efficiency:

- 1. Do you agree with our definition of water conservation and efficiency? Do you have an alternative definition?
- 2. Does your organization have policies or activities relating to water conservation and efficiency? If so, please describe them.
- 3. Do you have a water conservation and efficiency plan for the future? If yes, can you provide us with the details of the plan?
- 4. What do you think the challenges and opportunities are for water conservation and efficiency in Manitoba?
- 5. What, if any, impediments do you perceive to the adoption of water conservation and efficiency measures within your organization?

Please email your responses to the Manitoba Water Council at <u>water.council@gov.mb.ca</u> by January 30<sup>th</sup> 2015. We realize the timeline for this request is tight. The Council has been asked to provide advice and recommendations to the Minister by Spring 2015.

### Winnipeg Football Club board renewal process continues with four new members selected for 2015, including MHCA Pres. Chris Lorenc

The Winnipeg Football Club Board recently announced that Deborah Metcalfe, Gene Dunn and Jeff Thompson will retire from the Board of Directors, effective January 1, 2015, as part of the scheduled retirement of Directors. In addition, Trevor Kennerd has resigned from his position on the Board in order to assist with the 2015 Grey Cup Festival in Winnipeg.

The Board also announced Jamie Wilson, Chris Lorenc, Dayna Spiring and Bill Baines have been elected, effective January 1, 2015, as the newest members of the Winnipeg Football Club Board of Directors, to fill the four open positions.

All four new members were chosen through the open public nomination process initiated by the Club in March 2013. With these elections, the number of new Board members elected from the community at large has grown to six over the past 18 months, and it will continue again in the fall of 2015.



Nominees were considered from the 2013 pool of nominees as well as many new applications submitted in 2014. One of the four newly elected members

came from the 2013 group of nominees; unless they indicate otherwise, all nominees will remain in consideration for future vacancies.

'The quality of individuals who expressed interest in serving the Winnipeg Football Club as a volunteer Director is very impressive. This is very evident when we look at the skill sets and experience our four new Directors bring to our Board," said Board Chair Brock Bulbuck. New members of the Board include:

Not only does he have a strong background in education as both a teacher and administrator, Wilson has also spent a number of years in military service in both Canada and the US. Most notably, Wilson served as an Elite Forces Ranger with the 75th Ranger Regiment, US Special Operations Command. He is currently enrolled in the Institute of Corporate Directors Governance program at the University of Manitoba.

**Chris Lorenc** has been President of the Manitoba Heavy Construction Association for 23 years and president of the Western Canada Roadbuilders and Heavy Construction Association for 19 years where he has been responsible for all aspects of management, advocacy, public and government relations. He served on Winnipeg's City Council from 1983 until he retired in 1992. Lorenc is an active member of the Canadian Construction Association), serves as Vice-Chair of CentrePort Canada Board of Directors and Chair of its Governance & Nominations Committee, is a management representative on the Manitoba Labour Board, and has served on a number of civic and provincial policy related task forces.

**Dayna Spiring** is the Chief Strategy Officer and General Counsel of the Canada Wheat Board where she also serves as the Corporate Secretary to the Board. Prior to joining Canada Wheat Board she practised corporate commercial and securities law in Winnipeg. Spiring has served as a Director for Special Olympics Manitoba for the past seven years, and lead the team that brought Gold Medal Plates to Winnipeg. Gold Medal Plates is a prestigious national event which raises significant funds for Canada's Olympic athletes.

**Bill Baines** is the President and CEO of AML Wireless Networks Inc. and OMT Technologies Inc., and is the former President and COO of Manitoba Telecom Services (MTS). He brings extensive corporate and community Board experience, currently sitting on the Institute of Corporate Directors – Manitoba Chapter Executive Committee, the Asper School of Business Associates Board of Directors, and the Manitoba Museum Board of Governors.

### Surprise of the Year: Only one?

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Six years beyond the onset of global crisis, and the lamentation seems louder: pundits are increasingly perplexed by the planet's prolonged period of perpetual perturbations. We're living through a period replete with surprises – weather issues, political upsets, conflict, disease, economic turbulence, and so on. In fact, a huge surprise these days would be a year of no surprises. This too has been a year marked by what others have referred to as 'serial disappointments' – and the occasional upside. So, does anything stand out in 2014 as an 'out of the blue' development?

For the world's top economy, things began badly. Weather fouled the stats leading up to the New Year, and things got worse in the winter months. It cost the economy over 2 per cent of GDP – but there was a huge sigh of relief as activity roared back by 4.6 per cent in the second quarter and 3.9 per cent in the third. There's little sign of a let-up in the final quarter, capping a rebound that many consider a surprise. It isn't, really – signals pointed clearly to a multifront US revival, and bad weather merely delayed things by three months. Weather surprises that don't undermine the broader economy have to be expected from time to time – so this wasn't really the big one.

Maybe Europe gets the nod this year. After the fanfare in mid-2013 that hailed the end of its lengthy recession, the Euro Area came precariously close to a triple-dip this year. It set off alarm bells in financial markets, but perhaps the real surprise is that after all Europe has been through in recent years, survey results show that the Continent's consumers and businesses did not lose their cool; confidence numbers were remarkably resilient. At the same time, the Zone's greatest fiscal sinner is mending its ways. Greece expects to post not only a balanced budget, but a return to economic growth – well ahead of the doomsayers' schedule. Others are seeing similar progress; austerity is working. Wish we could say the same of Japan.

But could Europe be scooped by the BRICS? Maybe; one by one, they have posted discouraging results, and for various reasons. For those who hailed them as the new global growth engines, a big disappointment indeed. For those who see them as 'follower' economies, not so surprising. With the world still looking for a firmer footing, it's no real shock that the big emerging markets are doing the same. Strike this one, too.

The ebola outbreak was a nasty shock, and in a globalized world, the spread of epidemic is always an alarming threat. Thankfully, the issue has stabilized, and did not confirm the worst fears of world leaders.

Could this year's surprise be more on the political front? Perhaps. With increased democratization, we could expect that the cult of personality would be less of a factor. Yet with the passing of Mandela, South Africa experienced the end of an era – and at the same time, an economy sliding into disarray. The reform agenda of Manmohan Singh lost its momentum, but along came the lower-caste son of a tea salesman, capturing the national imagination and upsetting the status quo with promises of renewed reform. Joko Widowo seems to be doing the same with a populist win in Indonesia. And then there's the ever-popular strongman in Russia, who in the wake of his shocking international bravado cleaned up in regional elections this year.

Which brings us to the crux of this issue. Although 2014 birthed many candidates for surprise of the year, the top choice was actually determined early on. In February, the world was wowed by a very showy – and expensive – winter Olympics in a little-known part of Russia. Little did we know how quickly we would move from Sochi to siege, from a celebration of peaceful world competition to a conflict that threatens the world's largest economic zone – at a time when, although in repair, remains vulnerable to the structural fissures brought on by the Great Recession. With the ongoing impasse, there's still a lot at stake.

The bottom line? Given recent history and 2014's dark development, we can hope for no surprise, or a positive one in 2015. Maybe that would be peace on earth, for a change. Merry Christmas, and happy holidays to you and yours.
